Today (January 13th) In History Quiz

1900 - In Austria-Hungary, Emperor Franz Joseph decreed that this language would be the language of the imperial army to combat Czech nationalism.

1906- Hugh Gernsback, of the Electro Importing Company, advertised this for sale for the price of just \$7.50 in "Scientific American" magazine.

1942 - Henry Ford patented this automobile referred to as the "Soybean Car." The car was 30% lighter than the average car. What was it made of?

1953 - 3rd NBA All-Star Game, Allen County Coliseum, Fort Wayne, Indiana: West beats East, 79-75; he is named game MVP

1962 - He scores 73 points in a 135-117 win over Chicago Packers; at the time, most points scored in an NBA regulation game, and remains tied for 3rd-highest total

1965 - 15th NBA All-Star Game, St. Louis Arena, St. Louis, Mo: East beats West, 124-123; this Cincinnati Royals player named MVP
